

CHARTER

To further and implement the ideals of the relationship established in the document signed 9 May 1990, viz:

1. Exchange of civic organisations

Further Explanation

(Local Government Act and Code of Conduct)

A conflict of interest exists where a reasonable and informed person would perceive that a Council official could be influenced by a private interest when carrying out their public duty. Interests can be of two types: pecuniary or non-pecuniary.

All interests, whether pecuniary or non-pecuniary are required to be fully disclosed and in writing.

Pecuniary Interest

A pecuniary interest is an interest that a Council official has in a matter because of a reasonable likelihood or expectation of appreciable financial gain or loss to the Council official. (section 442)

A Council official will also be taken to have a pecuniary interest in a matter if that Council official's spouse or de facto partner or a relative of the Council official or a partner or employer of the Council official, or a company or other body of which the Council official, or a nominee, partner or employer of the Council official is a member, has a pecuniary interest in the matter. (section 443)

The Council official must not take part in the consideration or voting on the matter and leave and be out of sight of the meeting. (section 451)

Non-Pecuniary

A non-pecuniary interest is an interest that is private or personal that the Council official has that does not amount to a pecuniary interest as defined in the Act.

Non-pecuniary interests commonly arise out of family, or personal relationships, or involvement in sporting, social or other cultural groups and associations and may include an interest of a financial nature.

The political views of a Councillor do not constitute a private interest.

The management of a non-pecuniary interest will depend on whether or not it is significant.

Non Pecuniary - Significant Interest

As a general rule, a non-pecuniary conflict of interest will be significant where a matter does not raise a pecuniary interest, but it involves:

- (a) A relationship between a Council official and another person that is particularly close, for example, parent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, lineal descendant or adopted child of the Council official or of the Council official's spouse, current or former spouse or partner, de facto or other person living in the same household.
- (b) Other relationships that are particularly close, such as friendships and business relationships. Closeness is defined by the nature of the friendship or business relationship, the frequency of contact and the duration of the friendship or relationship.
- (c) An affiliation between a Council official an organisation, sporting body, club, corporation or association that is particularly strong.

If a Council official declares a non-pecuniary significant interest it must be managed in one of two ways:

- 1. Remove the source of the conflict, by relinquishing or divesting the interest that creates the conflict, or reallocating the conflicting duties to another Council official.
- 2. Have no involvement in the matter, by taking no part in the consideration or voting on the matter and leave and be out of sight of the meeting, as if the provisions in section 451(2) apply.

Non Pecuniary - Less than Significant Interest

If a Council official has declared a non-pecuniary less than significant interest and it does not require further action, they must provide an explanation of why they consider that the conflict does not require further action in the circumstances.

Complaints made about contraventions of these requirements may be referred by the Director-General to the Local Government Pecuniary Interest and Disciplinary Tribunal.

This form must be completed by you before the commencement of the council or council committee meeting in respect of which the special disclosure is being made. The completed form must be tabled at the meeting. Everyone is entitled to inspect it. The special disclosure must be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

iii. A pecuniary interest may arise by way of a change of permissible use of land adjoining, adjacent to or in proximity to land in which a councillor or a person, company or body referred to in section **443** (1) (b) or (c) of the *Local Government Act 1993* has a proprietary interest—see section **448** (g) (ii) of the *Local Government Act 1993*. iv. *Relative* is defined by the *Local Government Act 1993* as meaning your, your spouse's or your de facto partner's parent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, lineal descendant or adopted child and the spouse or de facto partner of any of those persons.



i. Section **443** (1) of the *Local Government Act 1993* provides that you may have a pecuniary interest in a matter because of the pecuniary interest of your spouse or your de facto partner or your relative^{iv} or because your business partner or employer has a pecuniary interest. You may also have a pecuniary interest in a matter because you, your nominee, your business partner or your employer is a member of a company or other body that has a pecuniary interest in the matter.

ii. Section **442** of the *Local Government Act* 1993 provides that a *pecuniary interest* is an interest that a person has in a matter because of a reasonable likelihood or expectation of appreciable financial gain or loss to the person. A person does not have a pecuniary interest in a matter if the interest is so remote or insignificant that it could not reasonably be regarded as likely to influence any decision the person might make in relation to the matter or if the interest is of a kind specified in section **448** of that Act (for example, an interest as an elector or as a ratepayer or person liable to pay a charge).

Discussion

As this is the last meeting of the Sub-Committee prior to the Study Tour Group's arrival on 29 July, the Sub-Committee members are to determine level of expenditure and put forward suggestions on a suitable gift to be presented to the Principal of Handa Higashi Senior High School by the Mayor at the afternoon tea.

Sub-Committee to note that until confirmation has been received on who will chaperone the guests on Saturday 30th July, the following bookings are yet to be finalised:

- Activities Saturday 30 July An alternate would be for the teachers to have a free day and attend with chaperone(s) the "Christmas in July" event being held in Laurieton that afternoon/evening from 6.00pm - 8.00pm.
- Venue for lunch for the teachers and chaperones for Saturday 30 July if day tour to proceed. Afternoon activities options could include a visit to Cassegrain Winery, a Cellar Door tour and wine tasting as per last year. Teachers would have a free evening with no formal activities organised.

A summary of the study tour costs has been prepared and forwarded to Handa Higashi Senior High School on Tuesday 28 June.

Council's bank account details have also be forwarded to Handa to enable the transfer of the tour costs to be made prior to the Study Group's arrival in Port Macquarie.

The renewal of the 12 month adoption of "Nani" the koala was completed on 23 June 2016 at a cost of \$50.00. The renewed adoption certificate will be forwarded directly from the Koala Hospital to the Mayor of Handa City Council and will be again written in Japanese. The renewal will continue for another 4 years until the 30th Anniversary of the Sister City Agreement as per the Sub-Committee Minutes of the meeting from 4/6/2015.

HANDA HIGASHI HIGH SCHOOL VISIT 29 JULY - 3 AUGUST 2016 INCLUSIVE

Firstly, on behalf of the Handa Higashi Senior High School and the Port Macquarie Handa Sister-City Sub-Committee we would like to express our gratitude to the teaching staff at MacKillop College and its student's families who have agreed to participate in this year's cultural exchange. The Port Macquarie Hastings-Handa Sister City Sub-Committee hopes you enjoy this experience and hope you establish a life-time friendship with your billet. The following information is provided in an effort to assist with hosting of your Handa student(s).

HOST FAMILY REQUIREMENTS:

Your Handa student(s) will be staying with you on Friday 29 July; Saturday 30 July, Sunday 31 July; Monday 1 August, Tuesday 2 August. Students fly out from Port Macquarie Airport on Wednesday 3 August. Each host family will be provided with an information pack which will contain copies of the student's itineraries, PMH-Handa Sister- City Sub-Committee contact numbers, basic Japanese phrases and a copy of a booklet which provides a brief overview of our Sister City in Handa, Japan.

FRIDAY, 29 JULY 2016

The Study group's plane touches down at the Port Macquarie Airport at approximately 12.55pm (QF2170). Members of the Handa Sister-City Sub-Committee will be at the airport to welcome the teachers and students. Upon arrival all students, with their luggage, will be transported by coach to the Council Offices for the official Welcome and afternoon tea with the Mayor of Port Macquarie-Hastings - Councillor Peter Besseling.

A visitor's information pack will be presented to each of the visiting students at the afternoon tea with the Mayor. These packs will be similar to those distributed to the Host Families but with visitor information brochures and a small gift for each Student

At the completion of the afternoon tea (approximately 2.20pm), the visiting students and teachers will be transported again by coach directly to MacKillop College. Once the coach arrives at MacKillop (approximately 2.40pm), the visiting students will depart the coach, collect their luggage, and then be introduced to their host students by the Principal and representatives from MacKillop College. If you want to collect your student and the visiting student at this time, please check and confirm with the school that both the visiting and host student are able to depart from 3.00pm onwards.

Past experience has shown that the students are quite exhausted after their long flights to Australia and have been known to travel in excess of 24 hours before finally arriving in Port Macquarie, and as a direct result, have been known to retire quite early on their first night in Port Macquarie.





SATURDAY, 30 JULY 2016

Visiting students are to spend the day with their host family. No formal activities have been organised for this day.

SUNDAY, 31 JULY 2016

Visiting students are to spend the morning with their host family.

A BBQ lunch for all host families, Handa visitors (teachers and students), representatives from MacKillop and members of the Port Macquarie-Handa Sister-City Sub-Committee is planned to be held at the Sister-City Park, Settlement Point, Port Macquarie commencing from 12.30 pm.

This is an excellent time for all host families and students to catch up and swap stories. The Port Macquarie-Handa Sister City Sub-Committee will provide the food and refreshments for all to enjoy at this event. The event will conclude at approximately 2.30pm.

Please bring chairs and picnic rugs, games eg. football/soccer ball.

Should the weather be unfavourable on the day, an alternate venue (the PMQ Sea Scouts Hall in Buller Street - directly opposite Essential Energy Offices) has been booked and a text message will be sent out to the contact mobile phone number provided on the RSVP forms should we need to implement the wet weather contingency plan.

MONDAY, 1 AUGUST 2016

Visiting and host students must be the school just prior to 9.00am this day.

Host students are to check with the coordinating teacher from MacKillop College prior to this day to enquire whether they and their visiting student(s) are required to wear their school uniform or whether casual clothing can be worn.

Handa students and their host students will depart on a charter bus from the school for a sightseeing tour at 9.00am sharp. The tour will start with an inspection of the newly constructed Charles Sturt University Campus. At the conclusion of the campus tour, the group will enjoy a morning tea/early lunch before the group re-boards the coach and heads off to Billabong Wildlife Zoo. There is no cost to host students to participate in this full day tour.

While at Billabong Wildlife Zoo the students will have the opportunity to be accompanied by a tour guide to view the Reptile Show, see Shrek the Crocodile and enjoy a Koala Keeper talk. They will also have the opportunity to feed the kangaroos and emus and visit other exhibits, and if time permits, visit the gift shop; which always proves popular with our visitors.

Afternoon tea will also provided for the group whilst at Billabong.

The coach will return to MacKillop College by 3.00pm, in time for their normal method of transport home.





Permission forms for the host students to participate in the full day tour have or will shortly be sent home from MacKillop. Please advise, via return of the permission note, if your host child has any special dietary requirements.

No formal activities have been organised for Monday evening.

TUESDAY, 2 AUGUST 2016

Handa students will attend school all day Tuesday and it would be appreciated if host families could supply **food and beverages** for the day – recess and lunch. It is envisaged that normal school activities will take place throughout the day. As this is our allocated sports day at the College, visiting students will be participating in the usual sport activities allocated to the host student.

The Handa Students are expected to wear their full school uniform to school this day. Please ask your host student to check with the Principal or representative from MacKillop if they (visiting student(s) are required to bring sports uniform or sports shoes to school this day.

Transport to and from school. Council has a long standing arrangement with Busways regarding travel arrangements for our visiting students, and as such, there is no cost to the host family if your visiting student(s) travels with the host student by bus to and from school. A letter has been prepared (enclosed in info pack) for presentation to the Busways' driver.

TUESDAY, 2 AUGUST 2016 - EVENING

In the evening, Handa Higashi Senior High School Students will host a farewell function in the private function room upstairs at the Port City Bowling Club, Owen Street, Port Macquarie.

All immediate host family members are invited to be a part of this event. This function is hosted by the Japanese students to express their appreciation to all the host families for your kind hospitality.

A cultural dance demonstration and possibly a performance of song by the visiting students will form part of this function and it would be appreciated if you could please remind your visiting student to take any cultural dress or props with them to the function.
