PORT MACQUARIE-HASTINGS

TERMS OF REFERENCE

Adopted: 18 May 2023

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Port Macquarie-Hastings Council (PMHC) has resolved to appoint a Sports Council, to Be known as the Port Macquarie-Hastings Sports Council (the Sports Council).

The Sports Council shall comprise of representatives of the sporting clubs and sporting community as appointed by Council.

2.0 OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Port Macquarie Hastings Sports Council are to:

- Assist in the development, review and monitoring of the Recreation Action Plan 2023-2028 which assists PMHC in the identification for sport and sporting infrastructure.
- Consider the cumulative effects of PMHC's decisions on identification of priorities for sport and sporting infrastructure;
- Provide advice to PMHC on strategic projects and PMHC policies related to, or that may impact on the implementation of the Recreation Action Plan 2023-2028;
- Initiate increased communication between the sporting community and PMHC to ensure that all existing and future needs and requirements of sport are identified and considered;
- Work with PMHC to ensure that sporting and recreation facilities are provided and maintained to an acceptable standard;
- Raise funds and source grants which will assist in furthering the objectives of the Sports Council; and
- Provide input to the setting and review of fees and charges for sporting fields and recreation facilities.

The Port Macquarie Hastings Sports Council will not consider:

- Sport and recreation program development.
- Sports club development and capacity building.
- Day-to-day operational management of facilities including sport facility allocations.

3.0 MEMBERSHIP

Port Macquarie Hastings Sports Council is to be made up of:

- Two Councillors (to be determined by PMHC)
- One representative from the NSW Office of Sport
- Up to 4 staff representatives from PMHC
- Minimum of 8 members, representative of peak bodies and major sporting clubs and associations that utilise PMHC sporting facilities and grounds

Representation to include links with the following groups/categories:

- Women in Sport
- Emerging Sports
- Access for people with Disability

Members will be appointed by Councillors via a Council resolution following a formal nomination process.

Term of appointment will be up to a period of 2 years.

Should there be a need for the Sports Council to continue beyond this time, a re-appointment process will be undertaken for all members in accordance with the selection process outlined in these Terms of Reference.

Specific representatives may be invited to nominate.

Members will be selected to ensure a range of sport codes who represent a range of Regions are selected for the Sports Council.

The Chairperson will be appointed by Councillors via a Council Resolution.

Vacancies that occur on the Sports Council will be filled by public advertisement and appointed through a resolution of Council.

Other PMHC staff, Government officers, advisors or individuals may be invited to Attend meetings from time to time to provide expert advice, information or presentations in relation to the Sports Council's business.

4.0 CODE OF CONDUCT

Councillors, PMHC staff and members of this Sports Council must comply with the applicable provisions of PMHC's Code of Conduct in carrying out the functions as PMHC officials. It is the personal responsibility of members to comply with the standards in the Code of Conduct and regularly review their personal circumstances with this in mind.

5.0 REPORTING

The minutes for each meeting of the Sports Council shall be prepared and distributed To members and published on PMHC's website.

6.0 STAFF

The Sports Council has no delegated authority to employ or direct staff or consultants.

7.0 FINANCES

The Sports Council has no delegated authority to expend PMHC monies.

8.0 MEETING FREQUENCY

The Sports Council will determine its own meeting frequency, however, is expected to commence meeting outside of business hours from July 2023 and meet a minimum of 4 times per year.

9.0 CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Members of this Sports Council must declare any conflict of interest at the start of Each meeting or before discussion of a relevant item or topic. Details of any conflict of interest should be appropriately minuted.

Where members or invitees at meetings are deemed to have a real or perceived conflict of interest, it may be appropriate that they be excused from deliberations on the issue where the conflict of interest may exist and this is to be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

10.0 MISUSE OF POSITION

No member can use information obtained through their position on this Sports Council for private purposes or private gain.

11.0 REVIEW

PMHC shall review the Terms of Reference at least every three years. If changes are proposed at least one-month notice in writing of the proposed changes will be forwarded to members of PMHC.

Pecuniary Interest

- 4.1 A pecuniary interest is an interest that you have in a matter because of a reasonable likelihood or expectation of appreciable financial gain or loss to you or a person referred to in clause 4.3.
- 4.2 You will not have a pecuniary interest in a matter if the interest is so remote or insignificant that it could not reasonably be regarded as likely to influence any decision you might make in relation to the matter, or if the interest is of a kind specified in clause 4.6.
- 4.3 For the purposes of this Part, you will have a pecuniary interest in a matter if the pecuniary interest is:
- (a) your interest, or
 - (b) the interest of your spouse or de facto partner, your relative, or your partner or employer, or
 - (c) a company or other body of which you, or your nominee, partner or employer, is a shareholder or member.
- 4.4 For the purposes of clause 4.3:
- (a) Your "relative" is any of the following:
 - i) your parent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, lineal descendant or adopted child
 - ii) your spouse's or de facto partner's parent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, lineal descendant or adopted child
 - iii) the spouse or de facto partner of a person referred to in paragraphs (i) and (i)
 - (b) "de facto partner" has the same meaning as defined in section 21C of the *Interpretation Act 1987*.
- 4.5 You will not have a pecuniary interest in relation to a person referred to in subclauses 4.3(b) or (c)
- (a) if you are unaware of the relevant pecuniary interest of your spouse, de facto partner, relative, partner, employer or company or other body, or
 - (b) just because the person is a member of, or is employed by, a council or a statutory body, or is employed by the Crown, or
 - (c) just because the person is a member of, or a delegate of a council to, a company or other body that has a pecuniary interest in the matter, so long as the person has no beneficial interest in any shares of the company or body.

Non-Pecuniary

- 5.1 Non-pecuniary interests are private or personal interests a council official has that do not amount to a pecuniary interest as defined in clause 4.1 of this code. These commonly arise out of family or personal relationships, or out of involvement in sporting, social, religious or other cultural groups and associations, and may include an interest of a financial nature.
- 5.2 A non-pecuniary conflict of interest exists where a reasonable and informed person would perceive that you could be influenced by a private interest when carrying out your official functions in relation to a matter.
- 5.3 The personal or political views of a council official do not constitute a private interest for the purposes of clause 5.2.
- 5.4 Non-pecuniary conflicts of interest must be identified and appropriately managed to uphold community confidence in the probity of council decision-making. The onus is on you to identify any non-pecuniary conflict of interest you may have in matters that you deal with, to disclose the interest fully and in writing, and to take appropriate action to manage the conflict in accordance with this code.
- 5.5 When considering whether or not you have a non-pecuniary conflict of interest in a matter you are dealing with, it is always important to think about how others would view your situation.

Managing non-pecuniary conflicts of interest

- 5.6 Where you have a non-pecuniary conflict of interest in a matter for the purposes of clause 5.2, you must disclose the relevant private interest you have in relation to the matter fully and in writing as soon as practicable after becoming aware of the non-pecuniary conflict of interest and on each occasion on which the non-pecuniary conflict of interest arises in relation to the matter. In the case of members of council staff other than the Chief Executive Officer, such a disclosure is to be made to the staff member's manager. In the case of the Chief Executive Officer, such a disclosure is to be made to the mayor.
- 5.7 If a disclosure is made at a council or committee meeting, both the disclosure and the nature of the interest must be recorded in the minutes on each occasion on which the non-pecuniary conflict of interest arises. This disclosure constitutes disclosure in writing for the purposes of clause 5.6.
- 5.8 How you manage a non-pecuniary conflict of interest will depend on whether or not it is significant.
- 5.9 As a general rule, a non-pecuniary conflict of interest will be significant where it does not involve a pecuniary interest for the purposes of clause 4.1, but it involves:
- a) a relationship between a council official and another person who is affected by a decision or a matter under consideration that is particularly close, such as a current or former spouse or de facto partner, a relative for the purposes of clause 4.4 or another person from the council official's extended family that the council official has a close personal relationship with, or another person living in the same household
 - b) other relationships with persons who are affected by a decision or a matter under consideration that are particularly close, such as friendships and business relationships. Closeness is defined by the nature of the friendship or business relationship, the frequency of contact and the duration of the friendship or relationship.
 - c) an affiliation between the council official and an organisation (such as a sporting body, club, religious, cultural or charitable organisation, corporation or association) that is affected by a decision or a matter under consideration that is particularly strong. The strength of a council official's affiliation with an organisation is to be determined by the extent to which they actively participate in the management, administration or other activities of the organisation.
 - d) membership, as the council's representative, of the board or management committee of an organisation that is affected by a decision or a matter under consideration, in circumstances where the interests of the council and the organisation are potentially in conflict in relation to the particular matter
 - e) a financial interest (other than an interest of a type referred to in clause 4.6) that is not a pecuniary interest for the purposes of clause 4.1
 - f) the conferral or loss of a personal benefit other than one conferred or lost as a member of the community or a broader class of people affected by a decision.
- 5.10 Significant non-pecuniary conflicts of interest must be managed in one of two ways:
- a) by not participating in consideration of, or decision making in relation to, the matter in which you have the significant non-pecuniary conflict of interest and the matter being allocated to another person for consideration or determination, or
 - b) if the significant non-pecuniary conflict of interest arises in relation to a matter under consideration at a council or committee meeting, by managing the conflict of interest as if you had a pecuniary interest in the matter by complying with clauses 4.28 and 4.29.
- 5.11 If you determine that you have a non-pecuniary conflict of interest in a matter that is not significant and does not require further action, when disclosing the interest you must also explain in writing why you consider that the non-pecuniary conflict of interest is not significant and does not require further action in the circumstances.
- 5.12 If you are a member of staff of council other than the Chief Executive Officer, the decision on which option should be taken to manage a non-pecuniary conflict of interest must be made in consultation with and at the direction of your manager. In the case of the Chief Executive Officer, the decision on which option should be taken to manage a non-pecuniary conflict of interest must be made in consultation with and at the direction of the mayor.
- 5.13 Despite clause 5.10(b), a councillor who has a significant non-pecuniary conflict of interest in a matter, may participate in a decision to delegate consideration of the matter in question to another body or person.
- 5.14 Council committee members are not required to declare and manage a non-pecuniary conflict of interest in accordance with the requirements of this Part where it arises from an interest they have as a person chosen to represent the community, or as a member of a non-profit organisation or other community or special interest group, if they have been appointed to represent the organisation or group on the council committee.

Important Information

This information is being collected for the purpose of making a special disclosure of pecuniary interests under clause 4.36(c) of the Model Code of Conduct for Local Councils in NSW (the Model Code of Conduct).

The special disclosure must relate only to a pecuniary interest that a councillor has in the councillor's principal place of residence, or an interest another person (whose interests are relevant under clause 4.3 of the Model Code of Conduct) has in that person's principal place of residence.

Clause 4.3 of the Model Code of Conduct states that you will have a pecuniary interest in a matter because of the pecuniary interest of your spouse or your de facto partner or your relative or because your business partner or employer has a pecuniary interest. You will also have a pecuniary interest in a matter because you, your nominee, your business partner or your employer is a member of a company or other body that has a pecuniary interest in the matter.

"Relative" is defined by clause 4.4 of the Model Code of Conduct as meaning your, your spouse's or your de facto partner's parent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, lineal descendant or adopted child and the spouse or de facto partner of any of those persons.

You must not make a special disclosure that you know or ought reasonably to know is false or misleading in a material particular. Complaints about breaches of these requirements are to be referred to the Office of Local Government and may result in disciplinary action by the Chief Executive of the Office of Local Government or the NSW Civil and Administrative Tribunal.

This form must be completed by you before the commencement of the council or council committee meeting at which the special disclosure is being made. The completed form must be tabled at the meeting. Everyone is entitled to inspect it. The special disclosure must be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

¹ Clause 4.1 of the Model Code of Conduct provides that a pecuniary interest is an interest that a person has in a matter because of a reasonable likelihood or expectation of appreciable financial gain or loss to the person. A person does not have a pecuniary interest in a matter if the interest is so remote or insignificant that it could not reasonably be regarded as likely to influence any decision the person might make in relation to the matter, or if the interest is of a kind specified in clause 4.6 of the Model Code of Conduct.

² A pecuniary interest may arise by way of a change of permissible use of land adjoining, adjacent to or in proximity to land in which a councillor or a person, company or body referred to in clause 4.3 of the Model Code of Conduct has a proprietary interest

Executive Summary

The Recreation and Open Space Action Plan sets the priorities for our recreational and sporting spaces throughout our region. It builds on our commitment to providing parks, sporting fields, and recreation areas with facilities that promote and contribute to the health and wellbeing of our residents and visitors.

At the Ordinary Council meeting held on 15 August 2025 (Item 11.08), Council resolved as follows:

That Council:

1. *Adopt the Recreation and Open Space Action Plan 2024 - 2029.*
2. *Note the information contained within the Recreation and Open Space Action Plan Community Engagement Report - July 2024.*
3. *Thank submitters and advise them of the outcome of Council's determination*

The current endorsed Plan can be found as Attachment 1.

This report is an update of the status of the projects listed in the Action Plan and details of the 2025 review that is currently underway.



Overview

We recognise the importance of sport and recreation as an integral part of our social fabric, generating community cohesion and attracting visitors to the region. Our region has some fantastic recreational resources including the Port Macquarie Coastal Walk, Port Macquarie Skatepark, many diverse playground across the region, our sporting facilities, and iconic beaches. It is vital that we work with the community to deliver and enhance these services and opportunities.

We need to be well prepared to continue the delivery of an appropriate level of recreational facilities and services into the future. This includes maintaining a commitment to the provision of sports facilities, providing for participation in unstructured activities and a variety of passive and active recreational pursuits.

Due to the increase in facilities and services provided to and required by the community, provision of these opportunities has become more complex. We plan, develop and manage suitable allocation of funding, resources and priorities to ensure all members of the community are offered the opportunity to participate.

The *Recreation and Open Space Action Plan* (the Plan) aims to provide us with the necessary framework to provide for sport and recreation facilities in the short to medium term.

March 2024 update

This is an updated Plan which reflects current priority projects required to meet community needs along with facilities needed to meet forecast growth in the Port Macquarie–Hastings.

The status of actions identified for delivery in the previous Plans (Recreation Action Plan 2015-25, Recreation Action Plan 2017-25, Recreation Action Plan 2019-25, Recreation Action Plan 2020-25 and Recreation Action Plan 2023-29) is outlined in Appendix 1.

The Plan has been revised to reflect:

- Changing community, Council and state government priorities;
- Changes of uses of recreation spaces during the Covid19 pandemic and the importance of recreation space;
- An assessment of user groups needs today and into the future;
- Opportunities to reduce overall project cost and minimise impact on user groups by aligning project stages where appropriate;
- Condition based asset information, providing clarity as to when assets need to be replaced;
- Likely availability of funding sources and consideration of alternative funding sources; and
- A desire to optimise the use of existing open spaces and recreation facilities.

This updated Plan identifies three timelines for delivery of priority projects:

- Immediate 2023-24
- Short term 2024-26
- Medium term 2026-29





Review

Each year an annual report which details performance against the agreed outcomes within the Plan will be reported to Council for information.

The Plan will be subject to annual review and it may be necessary to modify the action plan in accordance with changing community needs, financial position of Council, ability to deliver within timeframe and legislative requirements.

The Plan identifies a number of strategic planning actions as immediate priority for this financial year. Further actions or priorities may be included in the annual review of the *Recreation and Open Space Action Plan* following the review and development of these planning documents. A Places to Play Plan will be developed and will include playgrounds, outdoor fitness equipment, outdoor multi-use courts and outdoor volleyball courts.

While much of the responsibility for progressing these priorities will rest with Council, the community and other stakeholders also share this responsibility. Council, its community, land managers and other government agencies each have a role to play. Priorities identified in the Plan may be brought forward should funding opportunities become available such as grant funding.

Port Macquarie-Hastings Sports Council

In May 2023 Port Macquarie-Hastings Council (PMHC) resolved to appoint a Sports Council, to be known as the Port Macquarie-Hastings Sports Council (the Sports Council). The Sports Council shall comprise of representatives of the sporting clubs and sporting community as appointed by Council.

Benefits of the Sports Council

- The formation of a Sports Council provides significant opportunities for the clubs to take ownership of the prioritisation of future facility improvements and development in the LGA (Recreation Needs Study 2014)
- Formal, ongoing engagement with key local, regional, and state sport representative
- Implementation of a sports voice from local sport stakeholders with Council
- Transparent consultation to inform sport project priorities
- Early identification of priority projects to support strategic recreation planning

The objectives of the Sports Council are to:

- Assist in the development, review and monitoring of the Recreation Action Plan 2023-28 which assists PMHC in the identification for sport and sporting infrastructure
- Consider the cumulative effects of PMHC's decisions on identification of priorities for sport and sporting

infrastructure

- Provide advice to PMHC on strategic projects and PMHC policies related to, or that may impact on the implementation of the *Recreation Action Plan 2023-28*
- Initiate increased communication between the sporting community and PMHC to ensure that all existing and future needs and requirements of sport are identified and considered
- Work with PMHC to ensure that sporting and recreation facilities are provided and maintained to an acceptable standard
- Raise funds and source grants which will assist in furthering the objectives of the Sports Council; and
- Provide input to the setting and review of fees and charges for sporting fields and recreation facilities

At the February 2024 meeting, the Sports Council resolved to recommend the sport projects to be included in the *Recreation and Open Space Action Plan 2024-29*.

Executive Summary

This report responds to the November 2024 Council resolution (Item 11.01) requesting options for establishing a Sporting Venue Sponsorship Program as follows:

That Council request the Chief Executive Officer provide a report to the April 2025 Ordinary Council meeting regarding the options available to Council for consideration of the establishment of a Sporting Venue Sponsorship Program.

While sponsorship has the potential to offer additional financial support for facility maintenance and upgrades, this report outlines important limitations based on the regional business base, community expectations, and potential conflicts with local sporting clubs' own sponsorship arrangements.

The report highlights that the capacity of local businesses to contribute meaningfully at a venue level is limited, and that a formal Council-run sponsorship program may compete with or dilute support for grassroots club sponsorships—the very organisations Council seeks to support through access to well-maintained facilities.

Discussion

1. Background

At the November 2024 Ordinary Council Meeting, Council resolved to:

“Request the Chief Executive Officer provide a report to the April 2025 Ordinary Council meeting regarding the options available to Council for consideration of the establishment of a Sporting Venue Sponsorship Program.”

This initiative seeks to explore the feasibility of generating revenue through venue-level sponsorship, such as naming rights and signage, for Council-managed sporting facilities.

2. Key Considerations

a) Limited Local Sponsorship Capacity

Port Macquarie-Hastings has a largely small-business economy. Feedback from the sporting community suggests that these businesses are already financially supporting local clubs directly—through uniforms, equipment, and event sponsorships. A Council-led sponsorship program risks:

- Overburdening local business with additional asks,
- Redirecting funds from clubs to Council, and
- Creating sponsorship competition between Council and its sporting community.

b) Risk of Undermining Club-Level Support

Many clubs rely on local business sponsorships as a key revenue source. A Council-run program targeting the same businesses for facility naming rights or signage space may:

- Reduce club income streams,
- Create inequity between clubs based on the facility they use,
- Lead to friction or perceived favouritism depending on which businesses are granted naming rights.

c) Community Sentiment and Brand Sensitivity

Consultation would be required to determine if the community supports commercial branding of public recreational assets—especially where venues have historical or commemorative names.

d) Legal and Policy Considerations

Any sponsorship model would need to align with Council's Sponsorship and Grants Policy (Attachment 1) and likely require updates to:

- Naming rights procedures,
- Signage guidelines, and
- Community consultation protocols.

3. What Other Councils Are Doing

Larger metropolitan councils (e.g., Brisbane City, Newcastle) have the scale and commercial base to successfully operate venue sponsorship programs, often focused on major stadiums or high-traffic civic assets. However, smaller regional councils tend to:

- Use project-based sponsorships (e.g., for major events or a new facility),
- Focus on facility partnerships with government or philanthropic funding, or
- Avoid naming rights arrangements altogether to protect community and heritage values.

4. Ongoing sponsorship opportunities

Council may consider establishing a standing Expression of Interest (EOI) process for sporting venue sponsorships on its website. This would allow clubs, businesses, and community partners to submit proposals at any time, rather than waiting for a formal program or invitation.

This approach would:

- Provide a transparent and consistent process for sponsorship opportunities.
- Allow Council to assess proposals on a case-by-case basis for alignment with existing policies and community benefit.
- Encourage collaboration between clubs and potential sponsors.
- Reduce administrative burden while still allowing flexibility and responsiveness to interest from the community.

The standing EOI process could be promoted as part of Council's support for local partnerships and community-driven investment in sport and recreation.

Planning and Policy Implications

Any Sporting Venue Sponsorship Program would need to align with Council's existing Sponsorship Policy (Attachment 1) and have alignment to the Management of Public Spaces Policy. If a new program were to proceed, the following policy areas may require review or development:

- Naming Rights Policy – Guidelines on naming publicly owned assets, including timeframes, naming hierarchies, and community consultation.
- Signage and Advertising Policies – Including assessment of visual impact, brand compatibility, and equity of exposure.
- Sporting Facilities Management Framework – To determine whether sponsorship income would support maintenance, upgrades, or be distributed in part to clubs.
- Community Engagement and Consultation Procedures – To ensure transparency in the selection and approval of any sponsorship arrangements.
- Management of Public Spaces Policy
- Sponsorship Policy and Guidelines

In addition, Council's Place Naming Policy and any related heritage or commemorative naming practices would need to be considered when sponsorship involves name changes or co-branding.

Financial and Economic Implications

While a formal venue sponsorship program has the potential to generate revenue for Council, preliminary analysis suggests that the demand for such sponsorship opportunities in a regional context is limited and the cost of implementation may outweigh the benefits.

Major commercial sponsors typically focus their investments on metropolitan markets or large stadium-style venues that offer greater exposure and return on investment. In the Port Macquarie-Hastings region, sponsorship is more commonly delivered in the form of in-kind contributions, modest financial support, or direct sponsorship of individual clubs—such as branded uniforms, local events, or minor facility upgrades. Further, the condition of our facilities limits the opportunities or desirability for sponsorship.

Introducing a Council-led sponsorship program may also have unintended consequences for local sporting clubs. Many of these clubs rely heavily on sponsorships to keep registration fees affordable, purchase equipment, and support volunteer-run operations. There is a risk that Council seeking larger sponsorship

deals could divert potential sponsors away from the grassroots level, placing additional financial strain on clubs and their communities.

In terms of operations, establishing a formal sponsorship program would require dedicated internal resources. This would include the development and management of legal agreements, coordination of community and stakeholder engagement processes, oversight of signage approvals and installation logistics, and ensuring appropriate legal and risk management frameworks are in place. These functions would need to be resourced either within existing teams or through additional staffing or consultancy support.

Looking ahead, Council may wish to consider the development of a policy or framework to assess unsolicited sponsorship proposals—particularly for new large-scale regional facilities where there may be broader commercial interest. Such a framework would support transparency, ensure consistency, and help confirm that any agreements entered deliver tangible community benefits and align with Council's strategic objectives.

Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to provide the Port Macquarie Hastings Sports Council with the opportunity to discuss and provide feedback on the planned engagement with the sporting community on the proposed user-pay models for sports field access, aiming to ensure fair, sustainable, and transparent cost recovery, while supporting community sport groups and the ongoing maintenance of our fields.

Following input from the Sports Council on 4 March 2025, staff have refined the proposed draft Sports Field user pay models. The draft proposed models are now as follows:

- A Per Field Model
- A Per Participant

It is also acknowledged that an option to not propose any fees was also suggested when seeking input from the Sports Council, and this will be included in a future briefing to Councillors. It should be reiterated that at this stage the options have not been endorsed by Council at this stage and this information is only for the purpose of seeking feedback from the Sports Council and not for broader public circulation.

To ensure clear and consistent information, and to provide the community opportunity to directly provide feedback once Council has endorsed options, staff propose the following Engagement Plan.

Engagement is proposed to take place during July and August. This timing ensures we can connect with a broad cross-section of winter user groups while they are actively engaged in training and competitions. Staff will need to ensure that summer users are

actively invited to participate in the workshops, as they will not be playing during any popup engagements. Engaging during these months also allows sufficient time for any draft proposal to be presented to Council for consideration before the end of the calendar year.

1. Community Workshops

Format: 5 Workshops with a presentation, open discussion, and feedback tools (Posters with QR codes that lead back to a Have your Say website, collated verbal feedback.

Content: Overview of the 2 proposed user-pay models, the administration of each model, and potential fees and revenue generated.

Engagement Audience: General Sporting Community and overall community

Financial and Economic Implications

At this stage, the engagement process is intended to inform and seek feedback from the sporting community on the proposed user-pay models. No decision has been made, and no financial changes are in effect.

The purpose of this engagement will be to gain an understanding of the community's preferences, concerns, and priorities before any model is considered by Council at a Council meeting.

The financial and economic implications outlined below are indicative only and serve to support informed discussion and community input during the engagement process.

As previously shared with the Sports Council there are a number of factors to consider from a financial and economic standpoint as follows:

Indicative Financial Implications (if a model were adopted)

- Revenue Generation: Each model proposes a different approach to cost recovery for sports field usage. Dependent on the model selected, potential revenue would offset portions of ongoing maintenance costs (which currently exceed \$1,200,000 annually).
- Cost Distribution: Introducing a user-pay system would redistribute some operational costs from general ratepayers to direct users.
- Administrative Costs: New systems for booking, billing, and enforcement may require investment in staff time, digital tools, and customer service support.

Indicative Economic Implications (if a model were adopted)

- Impact on Clubs and Participation:
 - There will be economic burden placed on participants as part of any user pay model, if adopted by Council.
 - Hardship provisions may be needed to ensure continued participation, especially for junior and low-income participants. This may be managed by a shared approach between Council and the sporting clubs from around the LGA.
- Equity and Access Considerations:
 - Economic implications will differ based on club size, sport type, and frequency of field use.
- Wider Community Impact:
 - Revenue from user fees may enable ongoing maintenance into sporting facilities, improving their condition and usability.
 - Conversely, inappropriate pricing structures could discourage community sport participation, which may carry long-term social and economic costs.
